Here comes the sun!

We are almost at the end of another half term. Last week the Year 6 children completed their SATs (national end of Key Stage 2 tests) and were focussed and calm throughout the week, in the face of some tough tests which I'm convinced many adults would struggle with, particularly within the time given. We are proud of the

way they applied themselves; they thoroughly deserved a fun day of rocket-building and launching on the last day of SATs week and can now look forward to their last half term at TJS, which will definitely be more creative, exciting and enjoyable than SATs week! Thanks once again to all the staff who worked so hard to prepare and support the children in the lead-up to SATs and during the week itself.

Earlier this week the Year 6 children visited 'The Space' in Norwich for a 'Crucial Crew' event. Crucial Crew is an interactive safety initiative aimed at 10/11 year olds. It involves theatre style sets that recreate situations of crime and danger. The children experience and participate in a range of realistic situations which are potentially lifethreatening, in order to raise their awareness of what they can do to increase their own and others safety. Public Services and organisations involved included Norfolk Constabulary, St John Ambulance, Norfolk Resilience Forum, National Grid, HM Coastquard, The Matthew Project, UK Power Networks and Norfolk Fire & Rescue Service.

Other Year groups have been busy too: On May 15th and 17th, Year 3 travelled back in time to experience a World War Two evacuees' day, on the North Norfolk Railway (Sheringham–Holt). The children thoroughly enjoyed the day and learned a huge amount – a number of them seemed genuinely convinced they'd travelled back in time! On May 22nd Year 3 enjoyed a 'VE Day' celebration. On May 8th, the Year 4 staff and children had a Celts and Romans day at Norwich Castle Museum. A series of Roman and Celt characters helped immerse the children in Celt and Roman culture and history, developing their knowledge of the period, as well as their understanding of what it might have been like to be a Celt in Roman Britain. As we would expect, the children's behaviour on both trips was excellent. Photos from both visits are on the school Twitter account. Year 5 are looking forward to their visit to How Hill next month.

On May 2nd, we took a squad of boys and girls to play in Langley School's football tournament at Carrow Road (the children actually played on the hallowed turf!). The tournament had a slightly unusual format which resulted in the boys being slightly unfortunate in missing out on progressing to the knockout stage. However, the girls ended up winning their competition ('The Plate'), scoring plenty of goals on the way. Well done to both teams.

Following the waste audit on May 4^{th} , our 'Green Team' are busy planning how we can do more to reduce, reuse and recycle. Thank you to Mrs Clarke, and parents Mrs Skillings and Mrs Myers for all their hard work preparing and helping with the waste audit.

Thank you to all the parents who attended the recent learning reviews for Year 3, 4 and 5 pupils and the Year 6 open evening. Staff find these a very helpful and positive experience—I hope that parents/carers and pupils agree.

After half term we have lots of science activities going on. The 'Mad Science Company' will be kicking off events with an exciting assembly on June 4^{th} , followed by Year 3 meeting some 'Mini-Monsters'. We also have visitors from the council (to deliver workshops on recycling), the NHS (to deliver an assembly on 'Sun Safety') and the

RSPB. On the 22nd June, Year 5 will be entertained and amazed by Year 8 Taverham Hall pupils who will be doing some 'science busking'! Year 6 will be learning about Rosalind Franklin, the forgotten partner of Watson and Crick, and then endeavouring to extract DNA from bananas! Look out for tweets during June. Many of these events are free but the school and the PTFA will be covering the costs of those where a fee is payable.

As well as Mr King, whose departure for a Year Group Leader role at Dereham Junior Academy was mentioned in last month's newsletter, we will also be saying goodbye to Mrs Pearson at the end of this half term. Mrs Pearson is one of our longest-serving teaching assistants and is retiring, after nearly 20 years at TJS. Her quiet, calm approach and positive role modelling have benefited numerous children over the years and we will miss her. I would like to thank Mrs Pearson for her hard work and contribution to the school and to wish her a long and happy retirement.

I look forward to seeing many of you at the barbecue later this week and I hope you all have a relaxing and hopefully sunny bank holiday weekend and half term.

Mobiles, Smart Watches and Valuables



We believe that our policy on mobile phones is clear and wellunderstood by parents/carers and pupils. The policy is that phones are allowed in school but should not be used or visible, and must be

switched off. This means that children can contact their parents immediately before arriving at or leaving school and/or on their way to and from school.

Over the last few years, technology has advanced significantly and children are accessing and using other devices, such as smart watches, so we have recently clarified the situation with pupils: as well as mobile phones, no other device or accessory is allowed in school that could access the internet or take photos; this includes Apple watches and other 'smart watches'. Fitbit wristbands that merely measure steps taken, calories burned etc. can be used in school; however, it is worth reminding

parents/cares and children that the school/local authority is not responsible for any item lost or damaged on school premises, so it is advisable not to



bring anything of significant value into school.

Uniform

Please see below the updated school uniform guidance. All children going in to Years 4, 5 and 6 from September may continue to wear their existing uniform.

The new uniform will start with the New Yr 3 intake in September.

Uniform guidance:

- Mulberry sweatshirt (or cardigan) with school logo
- White Polo shirt(with Logo optional)
- Mid/dark grey or black trousers or mid/dark grey or black knee-length skirt or pinafore dress (Smart, tailored knee-length shorts or red/white striped or checked dress as a summer alternative.)
- Flat, black shoes
- Plain white/grey/black socks or plain white/grey/black tights

All pupils should wear a baseball cap, or similar, outside to protect them during hot and sunny weather.



<u>THE FOLLOWING ARE NOT</u> <u>ALLOWED:</u>

Denim, cords, leggings or track suit bottoms Short or long skirts or shorts Boots (of any kind) Jewellery (other than small, plain studs)*

Extreme hair cuts or dyed hair Nail varnish or make up Tattoos

*Studs must be removed for Games and P.E. lessons.


